

Types of Farming

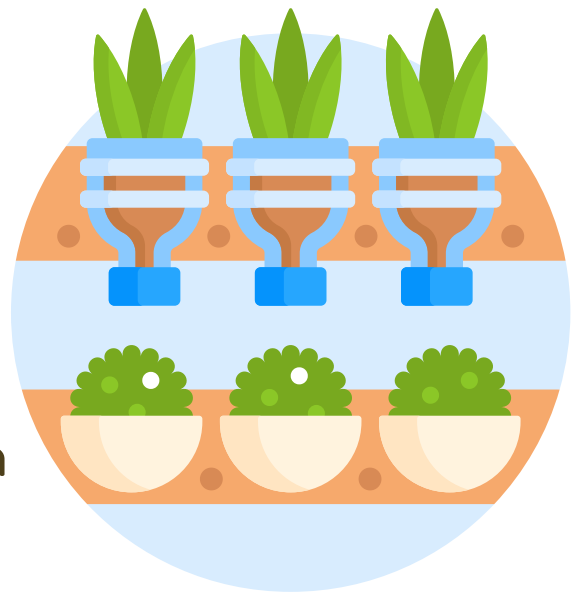


Mixed Farming

Crop production is combined with the rearing of livestock providing a balance & productive system to farming. Crop production, raising livestock, poultry, fisheries etc go hand in hand: Complimentary relationship.

Vertical Farming

Crops are grown indoors, under artificial conditions of light & temperature. Aims at higher productivity in smaller spaces. Uses soil less methods like hydroponics, aquaponics & aeroponics. Uses significantly less water & pesticides than traditional agricultural methods



Khazan Farming

Low-lying floodplains of Goa host an estuarine agricultural system called Khazan which is carefully designed topo-hydro -engineered agro-aquacultural ecosystem mainly based on regulation of salinity & tides.

Zero-budget natural farming

A method of chemical-free agriculture drawing from traditional Indian Practices. Originally promoted by Shubhash Palekar, developed as an alternative to the Green Revolution methods driven by chemical fertilisers and pesticides,
